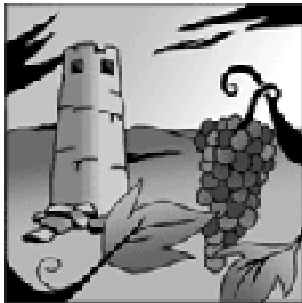

SERMON THEMES FOR OCTOBER



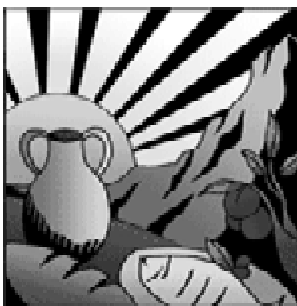
October 1st & 2nd

In today's gospel reading, Jesus tells a parable of the vineyard, an image of Israel, the prophets' mission, and Christ's death. For Christians, the vineyard also speaks of God's love poured out in the blood of Christ, given to us for the forgiveness of sin.



October 22nd & 23rd

Put on the spot by the Pharisees, Jesus displays wisdom by summarizing the law of God in just two commandments and by demonstrating the Messiah must be more than the son of David.



October 8th & 9th

Jesus tells a parable indicating that the blessings of God's kingdom are available to all, but the invitation is not to be taken lightly.



October 29th & 30th

On this day we celebrate the heart of our faith: the gospel of Christ—the good news—that makes us free! We pray that the Holy Spirit would continue to unite the church today in its proclamation and witness to the world. In the waters of baptism we are made one body; we pray for the day that all Christians will also be one at the Lord's table.



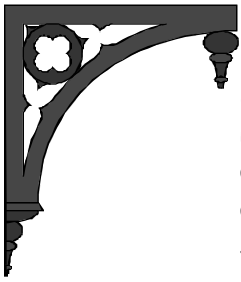
October 15th & 16th

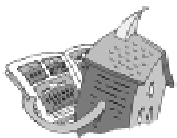
CALL COMMITTEE CORNER

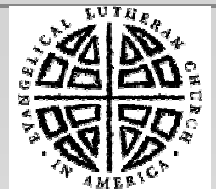

Autumn Mornings and Miracles

Even though I woke up early, this autumn morning arrived before I did. In the midst of my meditation I feel myself drawn wide, spreading with the morning light as it moves in all directions. I am like this morning, not wanting to remain. It is in spreading out that I find all that I am, and just as morning never disappears but appears as other than itself as evening, so I, too, seem different. To stay true to myself I embrace this difference, as every moment a new “me” reveals itself to me, and I must struggle constantly to embrace who I am becoming, only to discover that when I arrive I have already gone. The poet Pablo Neruda once observed, “when I write I am not here. When I come back, I am gone.” My life is so transitional, and each transition awakens a new hope. This is what all my experiences have announced, a hopeful life. Its theme has been, “There never was a time when I was not.” It is a theme that speaks of origin and destiny, portraying hope as the foundation of soulful living, and as the adornment of spirit. A hopeful life is grounded in the soul and lifted by the spirit. The Spirit must move to survive. Spirit exists in movement. When it comes to rest, it dies.

Awakened in the spirit, it is quiet as I meditate. For me, autumn is a season of hope, and I am looking forward to it, yet not wanting to miss the miracles of summer that still wait to be revealed to me. Wonder uncovers what is hidden in miracle, and people around me are filled with wonder, and are living out the miracles in joyful celebration. I am reminded of the words, “I lift up my eyes to the hills,” and this upward gaze grounds me between heaven and earth. Wonder breaks into this “in between” and removes the veils that cover over the miracles that have arrived here before I did, waiting my arrival. Miracles spend their time waiting to happen. When my journey intersects with the miracle, it makes the present real and transformative. I pray for this meeting of wonder and miracle each moment.

From the Minister of Discipleship and Youth

October 2011

I was on the treadmill at my gym early this morning when a speaker came on the TV talking about the about the third Commandment "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy." He pointed out that the Old Testament was talking about the seventh day of the week and cited studies that definitively identified the seventh day as Saturday. I got the idea he was trying to make the point that Christians were not following the "rules" by celebrating the Sabbath day on Sunday. He then said he had asked ten Christian ministers why we celebrate the Sabbath on Sunday, but not one gave him a reasonable answer.

If someone asked you why we celebrate the Sabbath on Sunday would you have the answer? First we must consider that the early Scriptures only speaks about the seventh day, the day of rest, and does not tell us what that day is called. The early Jewish people named the days of week with numbers (Yom Reeshon-1st Day, Yom Shaynee-2nd day, Yom Shlee'shee-3rd day, Yom Revee'ee-4th day, Yom Khah'mee'shee-5th day, Yom Ha'shee'shee-6th day and Shabbat-Rest.) It was not until the First Century BCE that we have the days of the week and even the calendar as we know it today. Once the Julian and later the Gregorian calendars were established, the ones we use today, the Jewish day of Shabbat or Rest fell on Saturday. Does that mean we as Christians are wrong for celebrating our Shabbat or Sabbath on Sunday?

No. There is a good reason Christians celebrate the Sabbath on Sunday. Early Christians began to celebrate the Sabbath on Sunday, the Jewish Yom Reeshon (1st Day), because that was the day Christ arose from the dead; the day Christ overcame 'death and the devil.' It was selected to remember Jesus' precious gift of salvation to all believers. Martin Luther referred to each Sunday as a "little Easter."

Is it important what day of the week we rest or is it important that we take a day of rest? Consider those whose occupation requires Sunday work hours. I refer specifically to those employed in emergency services (i.e., medical field, firefighters, police, etc.) Often they are unable to take Sunday as a Sabbath day. The Commandment has another important component "to keep it holy." If you are unable to take Sunday as a day of rest, are you taking another day of the week and devoting it to Bible study, prayer, praise and worship so that you can keep God's commandment to 'remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy?' Or do your days off become days for laundry, groceries, appointments, household chores and carpooling? Too often we get caught up in the legal issue and overlook the intention; put another way, we get caught up in the 'law' and forget the 'Gospel' of God's grace. We think of the Sabbath as a day and overlook its intention of rest, worship and praise.

From the CTK Spiritual Director & Coordinator of Prayer & Spiritual Prayer**"Over There": The Promised Land, A New Perspective**

Not all of us take our situations so seriously. God has made life an adventure. Enjoy it as much as you can and approach each day with anticipation and joy. The following story was sent to me by another visually impaired person who is totally blind. I was given permission to present it to you. Enjoy! I hope it brightens your day and lightens whatever load you are carrying.

As my guide dog [Shadow] and I stood in line at the checkout of the River City Market. I asked the cashier what I considered a simple question. "Where are the napkins please?" Her response was hurried, but sincere, "Over there."

Emerging from the light rail for the first time, I managed to catch the attention of a passer-by. "Please sir, can you tell me where I might catch bus 63?" A kind voice offered a pleasant response before disappearing into the cacophony of the early afternoon, "You can catch it 'over there.'" So many things reside "over there" -- napkins, bus stops, pencils, pens, clothing racks, department stores and even my shoes! A never ending supply of important and indispensable items and locales all reside in this place which is shrouded in mystery and intrigue. I stand in perplexed silence after learning that something is "over there". It is a place I have never been and have no hope of finding on my own.

My guide dog is quite skilled in finding chairs, stairs, elevators, escalators, helping me cross streets, and can even find me the Diet Pepsi display at Food Town; however, when I tell her to find "over there" her little bottom hits the floor and a small whimper tells me that she is as confused as I. We will not be going "over there" today. "Over there" has caused me a bit of vexation, a lot of confusion and, on occasion, made my heart race.

I have discovered that "over there" can be a dangerous place. One day, while crossing a street, I heard a driver's irritated voice shout out a warning of a truck bearing down on me from "over there". Shadow artfully dodged the oncoming vehicle and pulled me to the safety of the curb. Our hearts were both racing as we took a few moments to compose ourselves.

Close encounters with "over there" can be frightening experiences. Although many blind people have wondered as to the exact location of "over there," few have dared to venture forth in an actual exploration of the mysterious place.

One day, while standing in line at the supermarket, I asked the clerk where I might find the aspirin. With a cheery smile in her voice, she informed me that the aspirin was located "over there." With a weary sigh, I decided that I would take the extra step that would unravel the mystery, which had vexed my compatriots since the beginning of time. Taking a deep breath, and attempting to look nonchalant, I smiled at the clerk, "Where," I asked, "is 'over there'?"

I imagined the girl's shocked expression. I felt her sharing condescending and concerned looks with her fellows in the store. The silence grew palpable as they mulled the possibility of allowing a blind person access to the forbidden land. She had no choice; she would have to tell me how to find "over there!" I had won! Exhilaration swept through me as I waited in breathless anticipation. A victorious smile crept to my lips, my hand tightened on the handle of Shadow's harness; we would soon be going "over there"! The clerk's voice reeked with resignation as the decision was made. "That way," she said.

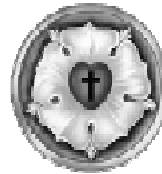

WISDOM

Wisdom is not knowledge. Wisdom is the gift Solomon requested. He not only received it from God but also received God's affirmation that he had chosen well. We also can pray for wisdom. In fact some people seem to have received it as a birth gift. Most of us, however, must seek it.

Knowledge is the awareness of temporal things. It can include facts, skills, and many things about the world around us. Wisdom is one of the spiritual things we cannot exactly explain. It is often associated with age. The Three Wise Men are usually portrait as old. Actually they were astronomers and what is referred to as seekers after the truth.

Wisdom is the term we use to describe doing the right thing or understanding what should be done in a complicated situation. It can be the result of experience but true wisdom is the gift of clearly hearing God's voice and acting upon it. We may need meditation to perceive what is being given to us, or the Holy Spirit may make us act without our will or thought.

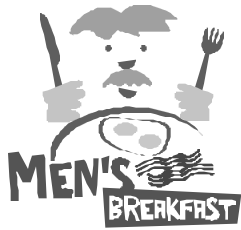
When miracles happen those involved often say something like "I don't know why I did it" or even "I didn't know I could" But wisdom is given to use consciously. It prompts us to love the unlovable, to help beyond reason, to do more than is reasonably acceptable and to remember that all we have is a gift from God, including passing along helpful experiences.

The experience of this ministry gave us the wisdom to know that the roof would be fixed. (Read last month's column.) The wisdom of experience tells us that next month will be better than last month. Vacation time is largely past. God showered us with enough to manage the obligations and to allow us to make the down payment on the roof contract.
