ADVENT BEGINS SUNDAY, **NOVEMBER 28TH**

The first season of the church year, Advent, begins on Sunday, November 28th. The season lasts four Sundays



and is a time to contemplate the impending arrival of our Savior, Jesus Christ. There are Advent materials for kids, teens, adults, and families, including some Advent calendars, on the rack near the mailbox hallway. Most Advent devotionals begin with December 1st. Choose the material that best fits your spiritual needs!

NEW YEAR, NEW WORSHIP SCHEDULE!



Beginning Sunday, November 28th, the First Sunday of Advent and the first Sunday of a new church year, CtK will begin a new worship schedule!

Weekly **outdoor worship** with Holy Communion will begin at 9:30 AM. For the first time since March 2020, weekly indoor worship will resume with an 11:00 AM service with Holy Communion and singing! Masks and social distancing will be required at the indoor service.

If you can serve as a worship assistant - reading the lessons and leading the prayers - or an altar care volunteer for either worship service, please contact Wendy in the office, telling her what you can do at which service.

Beginning November 28th, plans are to livestream the 11:00 AM indoor service. CtK will need people to help with indoor livestreaming. (During the winter there will be no outdoor speakers, so livestreaming the outdoor service isn't feasible. It will be broadcast on 90.1 FM.) Watch the Weekend Messenger for details about worship changes.

CHRISTMAS EVE WORSHIP SERVICES PLANNED

Plans for two worship services are in the works for Christmas Eve, Friday, December 24th. One will be a 7:00 PM drive-in service in the



back parking lot with Holy Communion, and it will be broadcast on 90.1 FM. The other will be in the sanctuary at 9:00 PM with Holy Communion, masks, and distancing. The 9:00 PM service will be livestreamed.

There will be no Christmas Day service this year, but on Sunday, December 26th, the First Sunday of Christmas, there will be relaxing, fun, song-filled services with Holy Communion at 9:30 AM outdoors and 11:00 AM indoors.

SUNDAY MORNING FELLOWSHIP TIME IS BACK!



As the weather has cooled, coffee is brewed before outdoor worship on Sundays, and there is also hot water for tea or cocoa. There will be fellowship time in the narthex (or outside, if

you prefer!) between the 9:30 AM outdoor and 11:00 AM indoor worship services. Since foam cups are environmentally unfriendly, please consider bringing your own coffee mug, or use a ceramic mug from the Cup Board in the fellowship hall - after giving it a rinse! (If people begin using many CtK mugs, we will need volunteer mug washers. Talk to Wendy if you can wash mugs.)

DECEMBER 2021

The Longest Night

Many years ago, not long into my first year of seminary, I stepped into a deep pit of despair.

I was surrounded, suffocating really, within and without, by a thick cloud of darkness.

I felt isolated, alone, abandoned even.

I was grieving, both for all that had been that I had lost,

and for all I had expected and hoped to be that never developed.

I was overwhelmed, filled with anxiety and exhaustion,

and I reacted to the people around me with agitation, irritation, and even anger.

Depression was the clinical name given to my official mental health diagnosis.

Whatever anyone wanted to call it, all I knew is that I felt terribly lost and hopeless. It didn't seem like there was any possible way out of the darkness, like I was stuck in the muck and mire of the deep, dark, dank pit . . . forever!

In the northern hemisphere, we are entering a time of darkness, as the natural rhythm and cycle of the seasons unfolds. The leaves are completing their journey back to the earth, the temperatures are falling, and the days are shortening, as we pick up steam towards the climax- the winter solstice on December 21 - the longest night.

Just like the leaves, we are invited to return to where we came from, to begin anew, to reset, to die and be reborn, again and again. We are invited into the darkness, into the beginning, into the earth, and into the dark womb from which we were born.

For it is in the darkest darkness that the Light shines brightest!

(Isn't it interesting that we hear stories of near death experiences that include moving through some sort of tunnel-like pathway towards a bright light, which exactly mirrors our birthing process from the dark womb into the light of this human experience?!)

Long, long ago there were many peoples and traditions that celebrated the natural rhythms and cycles of life. They were, and are, earth-honoring traditions, meant to connect and reconnect us to the earth, the natural elements, the seasons, the plant and animal worlds, the sun and stars and moon and heavens, to one another and our ancestors, and to the deepest parts of our own hearts, the Light and Love of our true nature, often hidden deep within the darkness of our inner worlds.

Then, when the early church formed and became the official religion of the empire, these earth-honoring traditions were vilified, demonized, and called (in an intentionally derogatory way) pagan. Of course, anything 'pagan' was, and is, heretical, bad, and evil; while anything 'Christian' is good.

Thankfully, today, we know better. We know this isn't true. And more and more people are remembering and returning to our roots, reawakening and rebirthing many of these ancient earth-honoring traditions!

In the church, we are also entering a time of darkness, as the natural rhythm and cycle of the church seasons unfolds.

Advent is the name we give to this time. We practice waiting and watching and preparing as we steam towards the climax on December 25 - Christmas - the birth of Light in the midst of great darkness!

Jesus, we call this great Light. And we place on him all of our hopes and expectations to be the light in the midst of our darkness.

And yet, here we are, still, thousands of years later,

and not only are we still waiting for the Light in the midst of our darkness, the darkness seems to be growing and strengthening and spreading.

Perhaps there's something we're missing?? Perhaps there's another way??

Jesus was/is also known as 'the Christed one.' We often say Jesus Christ, or Christ Jesus, but the more complete translation is Jesus, the Christed One.

This isn't to imply that Jesus is the only Christed One. Rather, we see that following the Way of Love that Jesus followed leads each of us to be Christed Ones as well!

Simply put, a Christed One is one who has turned inward, entered the darkest darkness, and dwelt deeply there, over and over and over again.

Dwelling in the depths of darkness deep within our own hearts and beings is not for the faint of heart. It is hard work, and liberating work as well! We come face to face with unpleasantness of all kinds - a buffet of hurts and disappointments and fears and scars.

When we are able to be fully present with what is, with no judgment, no pushing away, no holding on to, simply allowing what is to be, breathing in and out Love, little by little the heavy cloud of darkness begins to soften and lift, much like how the sun warms the morning and melts the dense fog away.

And much like the sun becoming clearer and clearer and brighter and brighter, the Light we've been searching for in the midst of our darkness becomes brighter and brighter and clearer!

And to our surprise, we find that this Light we've been longing and searching for, to dispel our darkness and fill us with peace and joy and Love, is within us!

This Light is within our own hearts! It's been there all along!

It always has been, is, and will always be!

It's never left us and we've never left it!

It's available any time- every time- we boldly and courageously enter the darkness within, dwell deeply in Loving presence (without judgments of any kind), allow what is to simply be, and return to the Light that has always been within us, always beckoning us, always showing us the Way, always ready to welcome us home!

This is the invitation that my experience of depression offered me.

This is the invitation the earth-honoring traditions offer us.

This is the invitation the rhythms and cycles of the seasons offer us.

This is the invitation the falling leaves and the longest night offer us.

This is the invitation the Advent season offers us.

This is the invitation Jesus, the Christed One, offers us:

'Let us dwell together, within our own hearts and beings, in our deepest darknesses.

Let us practice Loving presence in this place,

breathing in and out Love with whatever we find,

leaving all judgments at the door,

simply allowing what is present to be,

and meeting it with Love in this moment.

Let us find, and return, again and again,

to the Light and Love that has always been within us!

And let us nurture and grow this Light,

climaxing with new birth at the winter solstice and Christmas Day!'

What gifts of Love are your heart asking you to give birth to, out of your deepest darkness, from the Light that is, and always has been, within you???

So grateful to be sharing this journey with each of you, and so excited to witness and support the growth and birth of more and more Light and Love from within each of you!!!

CHRIST THE KING COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES from 10/11/21 at 7:05pm (Approved)

Approved Council minutes are also posted on the Council kiosk.

Present in person: Pastor Jeff, Mike Coss, Karen Reid, Katie Bach, present by zooming: Glenn Fasnacht, Bob Coleman, Sally Morris.

Mike Coss shared a song by the group Nickelback called If Everyone Cared, noting the meaningful lyrics especially "If everyone shared, nobody'd die".

Agenda for this meeting and minutes from 9/13 and 9/26 were approved.

Pastor's report: Pastor Jeff reports 672 miles. Pastor Jeff contacted the synod office and got information about a Congregational Resource Team to aid in transition. He also got info about John Sleesman, an accountant who works with the synod who may be able to help with our recent financial review report. On Thursday 11/14 Pastor and council will be on a zoom call with Hilary Beatrez to discuss the financial review report with us. Mitch at the synod office also notified Pastor that a complaint made by one of CTK's members about inappropriate behavior by Pastor Jeff was dismissed as baseless. Pastor will follow up with the member.

Mike talked about the plans for the next 3 Sundays leading up to the Gratitude Celebration. Week one 10/17-Receiving gifts, week two 10/24- Gratitude, week three 10/31- Sharing gifts. On 10/31 Icthus will sing, Katie and Sally will coordinate a crafts project, and members will submit gratitude response cards. Members may also wear costumes, and help distribute treats to children.

The Continuation and Improvement Plan will be presented to the congregation on 10/24. Council will present a plan which will reflect the needs of the congregation by funding all the ministries and prepare to fairly compensate the pastor and staff.

Upon reviewing the results of the survey about worship times, (60 responses) CTK will begin to offer 2 services per Sunday starting 11/28. The services will be 9:30am outdoors, and 11am indoors. This will be reviewed in March 2022.

Katie wished to review the endowment ministry grants for fall 2021. Although Mike Pereksta indicated the ministry could gift 22K, Katie's own calculations show more dollars available to gift. The ministry approved grants totaling 31K.

At the Nov.8 council meeting, Glenn will present the devotion.

On 10/14/21 at 7:10pm until 8:30pm all council members except Sally were on a zoom meeting with Hilary Beatrez, the CPA who reviewed CTK's financial records and processes. Hilary expressed his goal of presenting a neutral, objective report to CTK. He noted that he saw no red flags in the records and no significant misbehavior was evident. For more detail, see the actual report. In summary, Hilary noted that additional signers are needed for the Ameriprise account. Also additional checkers are needed to review all reports monthly. Also, there is no investment policy statement to guide the financial advisor and Hilary could supply a sample statement. CTK might need an endowment advisor (perhaps from the synod).

On 10/17/21 all council members met at 10:30am to discuss the presentation of the financial review report to the CTK congregation. This will occur on Nov.7 after the worship service. Prior to 11/7, an email will be sent to members to prepare them to receive the report. Each member present on 11/7 will receive a copy of the report along with some guidelines to help them understand the report. The report will be emailed to all members on Monday 11/8. Members will be given some time to read the report. There will be a short discussion of the report, focused on the "accountant's observations". Then questions, only concerning the report, will be answered.

Additional discussion concerned the need to purchase a camera and laptop to record the indoor service. Also permanent outdoor speakers may be needed for the outdoor service. Hilary has already sent the sample investment policy statement. Pastor Henderson from Lord of Life Lutheran is a member of the synod resource team who may help us with transitions. Mike C raised the possibility of hiring an independent attorney to review and interpret Jeanette Cooper's will for the congregation. Council voted to give permission for the Girl Scouts and the Chinese Christian church to meet in our building and also to allow them to have a building key.
